PRINCIPAL NEWS

Dear Parents,

While the teachers and staff had five day week of school, having a short week for the children was a great way for them to ease back into routine. Thank you to our hard working teachers for the welcoming way they prepared their classrooms for the children. We have enjoyed a smooth start and our Kindergarten students are settling in quite well after a very well supported transition program.

It is important for the school, children and parents to build a sense of connection, especially during these first weeks of the year. When parents and schools work together, children find it easier to know what is expected; parents understand how they can get support when it is needed and there is a feeling of being better informed about what is happening. One of the big benefits for children when this happens is a stronger sense of security and feeling of positivity about their school – two aspects of good mental health. St John's is a Kidsmatter school which means we believe in promoting and teaching about good mental health. Our Parent Information Evenings (see the newsletter calendar for dates and times) provide an excellent point of connection. The evenings provide parents with an understanding of how their child's classroom runs; clarity about communication with their child's teacher; how homework (home learning) will work this year; what is different this year from last; information about important events and a chance to ask questions as well as meet their child's teacher. I strongly encourage you to attend as a first step in helping to build a strong home and school connection.

We have two other key events this week to which you are invited.

Our **Welcome Liturgy** will be held on Friday afternoon after lunch. The children will begin moving to the Church from 2:00 pm and we aim to begin by 2:10 pm. On Saturday evening the first **Family Mass with the Parish** at 5:00 pm will be held. All families are welcome and Years 3 and 4 will be hosting on this occasion.

Finally, next week the season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday. Each child will receive the ashes in the form of the Sign of the Cross on their forehead. The ashes remind us of Jesus sacrifice for us out of love. It also reminds us that Jesus is always present in our lives, inviting each of us into relationship with him. Parents are welcome to join us at either of the Wednesday celebrations.

'The Light is on for You' project is taking place across the Diocese during the season of Lent. Churches will remain open from 7-8 pm on Friday evenings for people to pray, attend Reconciliation or to simply visit.


