PRINCIPAL NEWS

Dear Parents,

We recently held a meeting of our Advisory Council which is composed of parents and staff. The following information clarifies it's purpose:

The purpose of the St John's School Advisory Council is to serve, nourish and strengthen our school as part of our local Parish, wider community and Diocese by:

- acting with Strength and Gentleness as responsible stewards in sustaining our school Mission
- communicating respectfully, reflectively and collaboratively;
- using prayerful discernment in decision making;
- supporting parent engagement and partnership in children's education in faith and learning; and

• supporting school leadership and staff in the implementation and evaluation of the School Improvement Plan (SIP).

One of the issues that was discussed at our recent meeting concerned communication between the school and our families. A need to clarify our key forms of communication emerged. Listed below are the main forms of communication we use in order of priority:

1. The school newsletter published on the website and emailed to each family each week.

2. Email used to send notes and letters. You can also use sjan@dbb.catholic.edu.au to contact us.

3. The **Flexibuzz** application is used to send push notifications about events, reminders and quick messages on a whole school or on a grade or class basis.

4. Class Pages, often referred to as our Weeblies, communicates information from your child's class carrying relevant points for parents and children.

We are in the process of organising a Facebook page that will provide sharable news feeds about school events and happenings. Class parents may have organised their own form of social media communication with parents on an invitation only basis, however, these arrangements are done privately and are not controlled by the school. Any questions about school policy or decisions should be directed to the school via the above email address or by contacting us on 9971 9297.

On Tuesday morning I spent time observing morning drop off in Waratah Parade. It was raining, cold and uncomfortable. This is precisely the time our procedures need to be followed most carefully. While most parents are cooperative, there was enough evidence on Tuesday for me to ask all parents and carers to read and cooperate with our procedures and to have a mindset that focuses on 'cooperation and the good of all' rather than 'my need before others'.

I have included more detailed actions we all need to follow to improve things in the main part of the newsletter below. Council Rangers have been requested to support us in increasing road and pedestrian safety around our school.

Despite the wild and wet conditions, excitement levels remain high as our senior students headed off to Canberra on Wednesday morning. They return Friday evening after a series of excellent learning experiences at the nation's capital. Best wishes,

PARISH WORKS WITH US ON MORNING PARKING:

Following discussion at a recent Pastoral Council Meeting, the Parish weekday morning mass time will be changed from 9:15 am to 9:30 am from Tuesday June 12th. This will increase the time lapse between the finish of morning drop off time for our children at 8:40 am and allow time for parishioners praying The Rosary before mass to park safely in the Church grounds.

WARATAH PARADE DROP OFF AND PICK UP - IMPORTANT:

After observation of morning drop off in Waratah Parade it is clear cooperation with the following procedures would **SUBSTANTIALLY** increase safety for all and lower frustration at drop off/pick up times:

- LEAVE ample ROOM BEHIND FOR other vehicles;

- **STAY IN THE CAR**. Children should be ready, say goodbye in the car, get out of the car with their bag and walk straight into school. In the afternoon, the children should get straight into the car with their bags.

- PARK OUTSIDE THE DROP OFF AREA IF there is ANY NEED TO GET OUT of the car.

- let the CAR IN FRONT LEAVE FIRST.

Even though it is a short amount of time involved dropping off and picking up are is needed. Think <u>cooperation and good of all</u>' rather than '<u>my need before others</u>'.

Please communicate these points to friends, grandparents or relatives doing occasional Waratah pick-ups.

The summit is a key element of the Diocese's focus on the importance of the scriptures in our Catholic heritage and in the faith development of our children.

We feel it would be of great benefit to our community to have a parent involved as well as the staff who are attending. For example, there will be specific workshops for parents:

SCRIPTURE AT HOME

Parents are the primary faith educators of their children and therefore have a vital role in teaching Scripture. Yet many parents feel inadequate for the task and don't know where to start. This workshop offers practical encouragement and ideas for parents in allowing the Word of God to find a natural presence in the environment of the home and family living.

As well as keynote speakers discussing the "why's and how's" of studying scripture, there will also be workshops looking at music and art, including Aboriginal art, as ways of teaching scripture.

Students from our school are currently undertaking an education tour of the national capital. Students will be given the opportunity to participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy.

The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government is contributing funding of \$20 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards those costs. The rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion.


