PRINCIPAL NEWS

Dear Parents,

Bishop Peter Comensoli's words to our children at Confirmation were both delightful and challenging. He drew a comparison between children receiving their baby teeth to them receiving their 'spiritual' baby teeth at Baptism. Continuing the analogy, he compared receiving their second teeth as a time which signals our journey to greater physical maturity with receiving the sacrament of Confirmation. Through this sacrament we are awakened to ways in which we can form a deeper, more mature relationship with Jesus. Just like we need guidance, encouragement and understanding about how to look after our teeth, we need the same in looking after our faith. We receive this from our parents and our Parish community. If we want our children to grow in faith, we need to put the effort in as their spiritual guides. Congratulations to all children who were confirmed last weekend. A special thank you to Isabella (5/60) and Sally (ex-student) for stepping in to be altar servers on Saturday).

Our School Advisory Council recently met for our first Term Two meeting. We have begun work on reviewing our homework policy and guidelines. As a result of our meeting you will soon receive a survey which will seek your views on homework. Our staff and children will also be consulted. The data we collect will inform any changes made to our policy. I ask that you keep an eye out for the survey and that you contribute to the collection of data so that we can be sure to fully consider the views of our community.

You will see information later in our newsletter about a Mathematics workshop for parents (May 23rd) as well as an invitation to attend a Maths games session with the children (May 29th). Both events are aimed at re-introducing our 'Maths and Me' kit which has been issued to all families. While the workshop will target Years K-2, information presented will also be applicable to all primary years. Look out for a link on your phone, in your email box and linked in this newsletter to enable to take part in either event or both.

Finally, the International Food Night being organised by the Parish of Warringah is being held May 27th after our School/Parish Mass. The evening is a chance to celebrate as a community and to acknowledge and value the diversity in our Parish family. MAY IS THE MONTH OF MARY

Mary is known by many titles: Our Lady, Blessed Mother Mary, Queen of Heaven (Maria Regina), Madonna and Our Lady, Star of the Sea (Stella Maris) just to name a few.

But what does that have to do with Australia? Well, in the early days of the colony there were many Catholics but no priests. For most people, their connection to their faith was prayer, and the most common prayer was the Rosary.

The Australian Catholic community remained faithful to Mary and Australia was the first nation to choose Mary under the title, 'Mary Help of Christians' as our Patroness.

CHALLENGE BASED LEARNING

You may have noticed that our eco garden is looking very clean but bare.

This term 2G are taking part in a CBL unit investigating: "How we can use the Eco-Garden to show how to care for God's Creation?"

Do you know we have some amazing animals living in our school? We will be investigating how we can care for them. We are also going to be planting vegetables and herbs so that they might be used in our canteen our by our wider community to prepare meals.

We cannot wait to share more of these discoveries with you.



Inspired by Pope Francis' message "Laudato Si – Care for our Common Home", 3D are looking at the Big Idea of **SUSTAINABILITY** and taking on the challenge to:

CARE FOR CREATION AT ST JOHN'S - REDUCE, REUSE, RECYCLE

We decided that the first step of our investigation is to actually find out about "waste" at St John's – so this week we have collected a lot of data – we will release our findings shortly!



Year 5 and 6 are being challenged to **promote an understanding of others in our community**. They have spent time this week engaging with each other to ask wonder questions about our history, about interactions between the British and Indigenous people, about the Gold Rush and the influx of migrants to Australia from then and into now. They have identified some big ideas around multiculturalism, migration and racism and changes over time. They are very keen to learn more about the Gold Rush and how it impacted on the growth of our nation. They will use all of this information to answer the challenge over the course of the term!





MEDICATION

Please ensure, if your child will be taking medication during the week, that you note these details on their *Application Form.* It is our policy that all medication is clearly and correctly labeled otherwise the medication may not be administered. This includes both prescription and over-the-counter medication (e.g. paracetemol, ventolin puffer and antihistamines). If there are any changes to the medication your child is taking, updated medication information will need to be provided.

All medication needs to be packed according to the following guidelines:

- 1. Original packaging (Please do not use a pill cutter)
- 2. Individually packed for each child
- 3. Child's name clearly labeled
- 4. Medication name & dosage clearly labeled
- 5. Doctor's instructions
- 6. Doctor's name and contact details

It is helpful for the staff involved to have as much information about your child as possible so that we are best equipped to ensure the children's wellbeing and enjoyment on camp. As such, please ensure any behavioural concerns, dietary requirements and medical concerns are clearly outlined on the *Application Form* with as much detail as possible.

CAMP PROGRAM

Throughout the week, your child will participate in a variety of games and activities run by our volunteer staff. If you have any concerns about your child's ability to participate in these types of activities, please feel free to contact us.
