PRINCIPAL NEWS

Dear Parents,

We are in the process of preparing your child's mid-year progress report. All reports will be emailed Friday June 16th. Interviews with class teachers will proceed the following weeks and details of bookings have been previously sent home.

This is a time to check in on learning progress so far and to work together to set learning goals for the next two terms. It is important that parents meet with teachers to discuss progress. We want the meeting times at interview to be as productive as possible. In order to achieve this we send home an information form for parents to complete prior to interview. The form aims at helping you to identify the points you would like to discuss and it will provide teachers the opportunity to be well prepared for your time together. In addition to the report and the parent form, the children work with their teacher to identify their learning goals. These goals will also be presented at interview.

Kindergarten reports do not include grades for the various Key Learning Areas but they do provide information on general learning achievement. Grades are not allocated until Year One. Each report contains a clear explanation of what each grade means. It is most important to recognise the progress that each child has made during the semester and year. This will be dependent on each child's context and ability and it does vary from student to student. We are aiming for our reporting and interview period to be a time of celebrating learning as well as looking to the future.

We look forward to your support during the process.

We are in Wellbeing Week. We will be finishing the week with a celebration of Harmony Day on Friday. This special day encourages us to celebrate the diversity that exists within our school community. To assist with celebrations, the children have been asked to comes to school dressed in colours or dress that reflect your family's heritage or to wear the colour orange (shirt, jumper, pants, dress, beanie, scarf or the lot!). Please note this is NOT a gold coin day or a 'mufti day'; simply a statement we are making as a school.

Finally thank you for supporting our call to write urgently to our Government ministers with a plea to review the legislation about to pass through the Senate in relation to school funding. An information evening is being held tonight at St Kieran's **Manly Vale beginning at 7pm** to explain the situation. Our Director, Mr Peter Hamill, will be addressing the meeting and all are welcome. I emphasise that St John's is in a positive position in relation to the changes but many of our Catholic systemic schools will be facing significant fee increases should this legislation be passed. We are fighting for our family of Catholic schools.

Changes to Catholic School funding

Over the last week, all families should have received correspondence from the Director of Schools, Mr Peter Hamill, containing important information about the Commonwealth Government's proposal to amend *The Education Act* in a way that will impact school funding in Australia and as a result directly affect our children and our families.

While the amendments will have a modest effect on current school fees for families at St John's, Narraweena for 2018, there are wider and significant implications for systems of Catholic schools and for many of our families with children attending Catholic schools on the northern beaches and north shore in particular.



Canteen News – How to cancel lunch orders on Qkr! when your child is ill or away

Did you know you can get credits on Qkr! for when your child is away? The two articles below explain the process, please take the time to read them, and remember the order needs to be cancelled by 8.30am on the day. Please also ensure you always receive a receipt for any Qkr! transaction to ensure the order has gone through. **Next week – there's beautiful fresh tortellini and pumpkin soup to try, bon appetite!**



Can I cancel orders and get a refund?

Cancelling food orders that have already been paid for:

To cancel a food order from your itemized eReceipt:

1. Sign in to your Qkr account and scroll down to 'My Receipts' section

2. Select eReceipt for order you wish to cancel

3. You will see a red circle containing the 'minus' symbol beside your child's photo. Tap this. A pop-up box will appear asking if you wish to proceed. Tap 'Yes'

If your eReceipt contains food orders for more than one child, you will need to cancel one by one.

OR To cancel a food order from the calendar view

1. Sign in to your Okr account and go to calendar view.

Sign in to your Qkr account and go to calendar view for food orders
Select date for which you wish to cancel order

3. Tap 'Cancel Items' on the pop-up box which appears

Another pop-up box will appear asking if you wish to proceed. Tap 'yes'

To reduce school costs, cancelled food orders are refunded in the form of credit for future orders. A 'Refunded' stamp will appear on your eReceipt confirming that the order has been cancelled and a credit is available for future food orders. The value of any outstanding food order credits will automatically be deducted from your next Qkr food order.

Please contact your school office directly to cancel any other (non-food) school payments. These refunds needs to be

processed through the school office according to school policy.


