We ask you to understand the sensitivity of the situation given Finn has sisters Scarlett (Yr 3NG) and Scout (Yr1G) at St John's.

#### SCHOOL ATTENDANCE AND ABSENCES

Regular school attendance is an important factor in successful learning and social development for all children. Unfortunately genuine illness or injury necessitates absence for shorter or sometimes longer periods – this is part of life and totally understandable. Prompt explanation of absence by parents and carers is required either by Flexibuzz, dated note, email or phone call to the school. We are required to provide regular reporting to Commonwealth Government authorities on attendance via our electronic roll and to assess explanations for absence as justifiable or unjustifiable. We are also required to follow up on unexplained absences. Providing an explanation for absence saves your teacher a considerable amount of time.

Extended absences are not encouraged for the reasons mentioned above. An application for extended absence (10 days or more) must be completed and submitted for approval to the principal prior to the absence taking place. Forms are available on our <u>website</u> including absence notes.

Please note that morning assembly is part of the school day (8:40 am). Children are expected to attend. We encourage children to be at school for the full day unless there is a justifiable and fully explainable reason (note or email) for them to leave school early or arrive late; or special arrangements have been put in place by the school.

#### SCHOOL FEE PAYMENTS

You would have received your statements for this term. Prompt payment is always appreciated.

The Catholic Schools Office (CSO) has established a Fees Liaison Unit which can support the school and families in relation to school fee questions or issues – more information about the unit and its function will be sent from the CSO to all families in coming weeks.

The St John's Athletics Carnival will take place next week on Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> July at the Sydney Academy of Sport and Recreation, Narrabeen. It is a regular school day and all children must attend.

#### WELLBEING AND SOCIAL SKILLS

At St John's we believe in the importance of caring for and supporting the 'whole child'. This means we focus not only on the academic development of our students, but also their spiritual, physical, social and emotional development.

This term we have a few different initiatives running within classrooms and across the school to support the development of social skills for our students.

These include different lunch time activities:

Mondays – *Coding Club (K-2)* in the library Tuesdays – *Coding Club (3-6)* in Room 9 Wednesdays – *Gardening (K-6)* in the Eco Garden Thursdays – *Lunch Club/Sewing Club (K-6)* in the hall Fridays – *Social Skills Games/Chess/Lunch Club (K-6)* in the library

We encourage you to speak with your child about their social and emotional skills and support them to develop their ability to bounce back from problems (to develop resilience), to know who they can talk to if they have a problem, to develop problem-solving skills (including learning how to compromise), to think about the feelings of others (to develop empathy), and to treat others how they would like to be treated (to live as a disciple of Jesus).

#### **BOOT FOR NETS**




