Dear Parents,

A percentage of all sales is given back to the school by Scholastic and we have so far made enough money to receive around \$700 worth of donated books.








Grade	Number Ninja Warrior Challenge				
Kindergarten	 The number is between 1 and 10. The number is closer to 10 than 0. I cannot make equal groups with this number. The number and 3 makes 10. It is one less than 8. 				
Year 1	 My number is an odd number. It is between 100- 150. If you count by 5s, you will say the number. The tens digit is even. There are no zeros. My hundreds digit is one less than the tens digit. 				
Year 2	 My number is between 200 and 400. The sum of my digits is 11. If I skip counted by 2s starting at 200, I would land on my number. The digit in the ones place is double the digit in the hundreds place. My number is closer to 200. 				
Year 3	 My number is between 7500 and 8220. The hundreds digit is double the number in the tens column. When multiplied, the product of my tens digit and my ones digit is 27. The hundreds digit is one less than my thousands digit. 				
Year 4	 The number is between 410 and 415. The number in the ones column is half the number in the hundreds column. If the number is multiplied by an even number, the results is a whole number. There are no zeros in any of the decimal places. The number contains 4 digits. The product of the digits is 40.

- 1. The number is between 4000 and 8000.
- 2. The number is palindromic.
- 3. The sum of the digits is 20.
- 4. $\frac{1}{2}$ of my number is also a palindromic number.
- 5. $\frac{2}{8}$ of the number is 1166.


