Dear Parents,

We are fast approaching the end of Term Three. Next Monday morning we will be holding our Core Values Assembly in the school hall. The assembly acknowledges our school values of compassion, celebration, hope, service, justice and respect and recognises where these values have been displayed in our own lives and through our daily school lives during the term. The children who will be receiving their award on Monday provide inspiration for all of us to be mindful of these touch stones in our own lives. It was really encouraging to hear our children being able to name many of our core values last weekend at the First Communion masses when Father asked the children what needed to be done to live more like Jesus.

Our Year 3 and Year 5 children took part in the online NAPLAN trials during the week. This was an exercise that was really focused on testing the environment more than the academics. The NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA) wants to look at the practicalities of introducing online assessment and the feedback from schools is extremely important. Taking part in the trial was a very worthwhile experience and enabled us to provide some very useful and practical feedback to the authorities for the future. Mrs Nelson-Smith and Mrs Stachersky worked particularly hard to ensure the trial at St John's ran as smoothly as possible.

A reminder that as the weather begins to change and we experience hotter days, the children can move between summer and winter uniforms before moving to summer uniform for the beginning of Term 4 (October 9th).

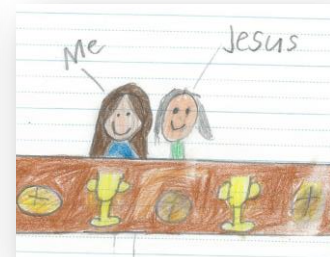
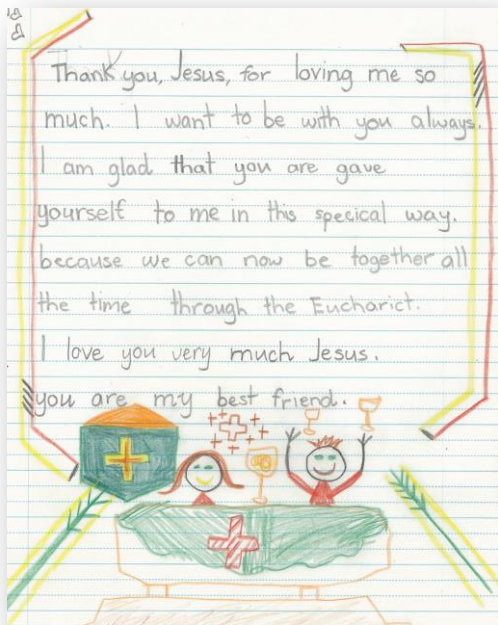

Congratulations to all those children who have now received Jesus for the first time, and our prayers are with those children who will make their First Communion this weekend.

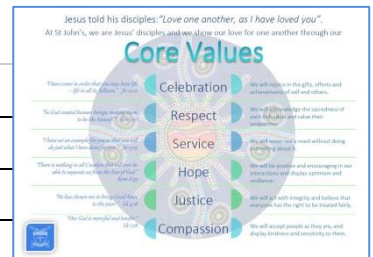

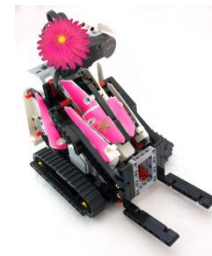

If your child hasn't got a NetBank client number, you can set this up by visiting your nearest CommBank branch with your driver licence and child's birth certificate.

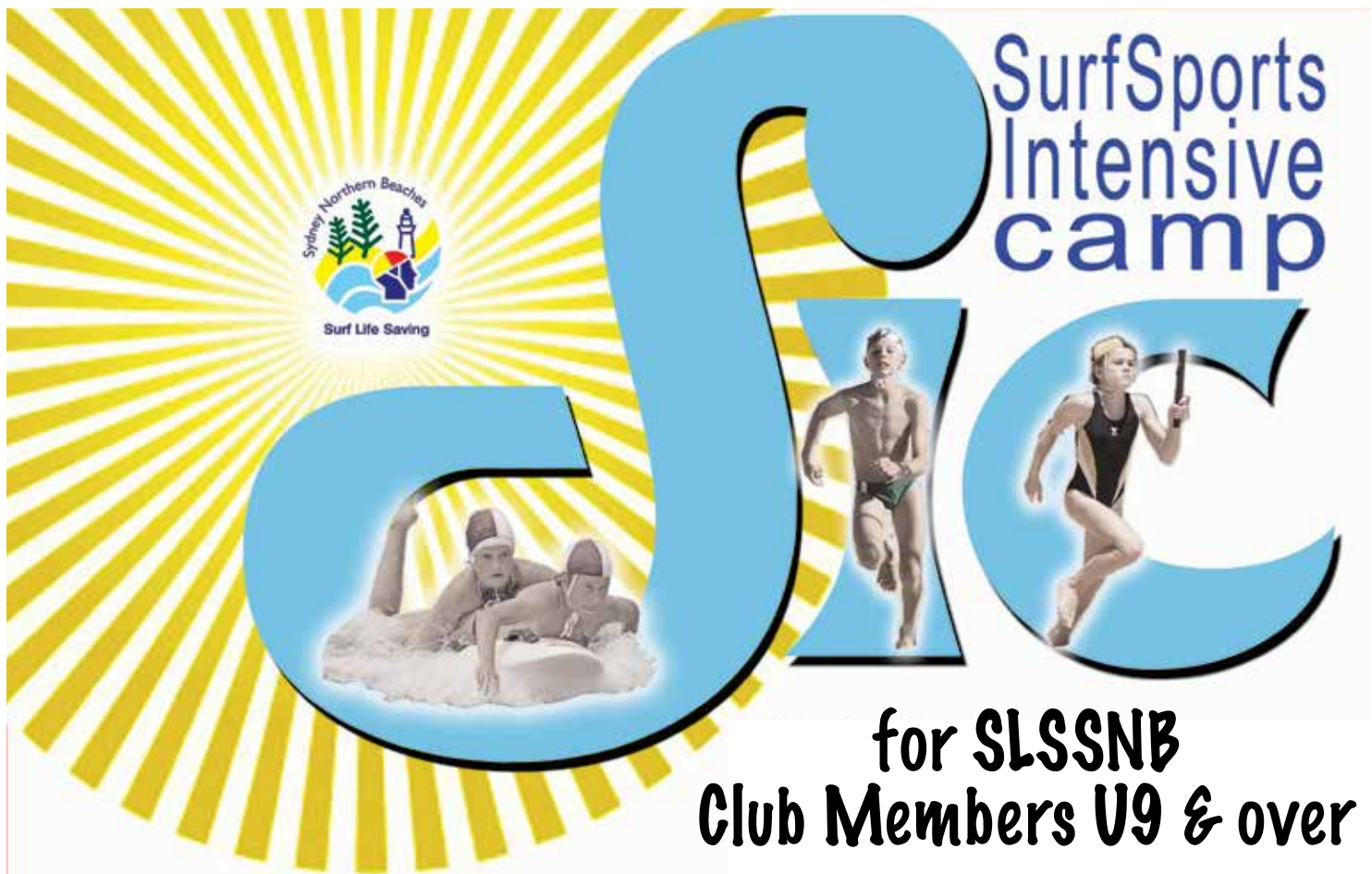
