PRINCIPAL NEWS

Dear Parents,

Next week we have the Annual General Meeting (AGM) of St John's Parents and Friends. You have received information about the meeting in recent weeks. I will provide an update on a number of matters including our School Improvement Plan (SIP) and class arrangements for 2018 following recent discussions with staff and the School Advisory Council. The meeting will also provide an opportunity to celebrate the support we have received from parents in so many ways during the year. All parents are invited.

The children attended mass with the Parish yesterday morning to celebrate 'All Saints Day' which is a solemn day in the Church year. While many of the children enjoyed the fun of Halloween in their neighbourhoods on Tuesday evening, All Saints Day on Wednesday helped them to think about the qualities of saints and the call for each of us to be saints in our lives. At our Advisory Council meeting on Tuesday evening our prayer included a call to think about the actual people in our lives who have qualities that we admire - saint like qualities. We used the names of these people and the list of qualities to create our own litany of saints and in doing so were able to reflect on the presence of Christ within others. In particular we noted the saint like qualities of Finn Marker and Anna Kauffmann.

In other news, the children are preparing for our Mission Day which will be held Thursday, November 9th. Mission Day features a student run activity session between recess and lunchtime. Each class has created a range of activities for children to enjoy in return for a small donation towards a number of charitable organisations like Caritas and Bear Cottage. Mission Day is a very practical and enjoyable way to encourage the children to think of others. Parent support of the day is very much appreciated.

Freddie and Sarah F will be walking on Sunday 26th November in the Walk4BrainCancer Manly fundraiser.



Why do we have a Talent Quest?

The Talent Quest serves two main purposes. It allows us to be disciples who reach out to help others because we raise funds for Catholic Mission and it is fun to share our gifts and talents to entertain our friends.

What "talents" are we looking for?

Singing, dancing, a musical instrument, magic shows, a little play...you name it – we'll love it! It can be a solo act or with a group.

When do entries close?

Entries close on Tuesday 31st October - Week 4

What days and times are the heats on?

Dates for the heats will be decided once we have all the entries in.

The children's heats will be posted in the library window. Buddies work with the younger children to find their heats. All heats begin at 1:15 and finish at approx 2:00.

If your child is unable to perform for a legitimate reason (eg: doctor's appointment/illness) we will look at rescheduling – please notify your class teacher via tigbiz.

Are parents invited to the talent quest?

Parents are invited to watch the finals of the Talent Quest.

If you wish to come and watch your children in their heats you are able to do so. However, it is not an expectation and there will be no changes made to heat schedules to accommodate parents. The Talent Quest is first and foremost for the students.

Choosing appropriate costumes and music.

Please remember the children are performing at a Catholic Primary School with 5 year olds in the audience. Outfits that might be acceptable at dance class are not necessarily appropriate for the talent quest. Simple is always best and no-one is expected to buy anything for the Talent Quest. The group does not need to go and buy matching outfits. Make sure that EVERYTHING is labelled (especially the uniform they take off).

Check the lyrics of any song your child is singing or dancing to – you can do this on the internet. The fact that a song has a radio edit indicates that the original does have inappropriate content.

Can my child wear make-up for the Talent Quest?

No make-up is to be worn during the heats or finals of the talent quest.

Can I come and take my child out of class to get ready before their performance?

Simple answer - no.

The lunch bell goes at 1:15 and the Talent Quest does not take precedence over learning.

What if my child joins a group or decides they do not want to be in the Talent Quest?

If they are joining a group that has already put in their entry form (or they are pulling out of a group) – there is no need to advise anyone – the group will still perform.

If they are a solo performer who no longer wants to perform, they need to advise Mrs Nelson-Smith (3NG) or Miss Gorman (1G).

When will I know if my child is in the Finals?

Details of the finals will be posted when the heats are finished. As this can be fluid, we can't give you an exact date but it will be around the end of Week 8. Finalists are posted around the school as well as on the weebly. Again, we are promoting independence in the children - they are encouraged to check the lists (buddies will help).

When are the Finals?

K-2 Finals are on Wednesday 13th December at 11:15

3-6 Finals are on Thursday 14th December at 11:15

We cannot make changes to the run order of the Finals to accommodate parents.
