Dear Parents

This week, the children in our Parish, including our Year 3 children, made their First Reconciliation. Receiving a sacrament is always a very special occasion for the children and their families. At this time of Lent, when our focus is on strengthening our relationship with Jesus and on preparing for the great celebration of Easter, receiving Reconciliation has even more significant meaning. We were blessed to have our parents, Miss Dunk and parishioners volunteer as group facilitators during the preparation sessions. Their role was to support our children and parents to engage with materials provided by the diocese rather than lead the groups in the activities. We very much appreciate their generosity and commitment to the program and their groups.





It was great to see our children supporting Harmony Day yesterday. While the variety of colours in our clothing brightened up the day, our purpose was to provide an opportunity to build awareness about the diversity that exists within our school and to discuss how valuable this is to St John's. Parent support of Harmony Day does help us to work towards this goal. I encourage you to talk as a family about some examples of diversity in your own experience. This will help build on the children's learning at school.

I trust that three way interviews being held at the moment are providing parents, children and teachers with some clear goals for learning leading into term two. There's no doubt our decision to run interviews earlier this year has created a very busy term for us all, however, we believe that the effort everyone has put in has helped in creating a climate in which are doing our best to work together on your child's learning.

A reminder that mid-year reports will be sent home at the end of the Term 2 and optional interviews will be offered at that time to discuss progress. Parents may contact the school to arrange an appointment with the teacher to discuss your child's progress at any time during the year.

Finally, parents will receive a letter from our Director of Schools, Peter Hamill concerning media reports about Catholic Schools today. Please keep your eye out for his communication as it contains some important and reassuring messages concerning school fees and our school system.

LIBRARY NEWS

Monday March 19th was International 'Read to ME Day'.

A big thank you to the parents who came in and read to small groups of children. The day was great reminder for everyone about not only the importance of reading to children but the joy it can bring.

Reminder: All children in Kindergarten – Year 2 require a Library bag to borrow. This can be a canvas or calico bag, a shopping bag, or even an old pillow slip. Many children are disappointed when they miss out on borrowing so please try and pack their school bag the night before where possible.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

Thank you to the families who came to the Parish Stations of the Cross last Friday night. We were very proud of the way the children led us through Christ's journey. For children, the story is not an easy one – Christ's death was not an easy one, but must be put in context of the times in which he lived and in the context of the Resurrection story.

His death and resurrection need to be told as a whole story. There's some understanding about the times in which he lived that helps separate the actions from the way we live today. The idea of people doing things differently in Jesus day helps contextualise it.



Some key ideas for talking to young children:

- Jesus was a kind and brave man. Many people loved him but there were others who didn't like him.
- Back in Jesus's time, crucifixion was not uncommon. While we put people in gaol for crimes they punished them more severely. People who didn't like Jesus wanted him treated like a criminal even though he wasn't.
- The people who didn't like him had him arrested and killed in that cruel way.
- Jesus died. Unlike anybody else he came alive again only God can do that.

An article about talking to children about Jesus' crucifixion from a parent's point of view can be found at: http://www.catholicallyear.com/2014/04/how-to-talk-to-little-kids-about.html - It has a lot of ideas that may or may not be suitable for your child but for me, an important line in the article is "If they have questions, I answer them. If they don't have questions, that's fine." It's a story they hear every Lent and like most concepts, their understanding will deepen each time.

It is also important to remember that the story of the crucifixion must be considered in context with the joy of the Resurrection! Jesus had to die...so he could rise!

SCHOOL INTERVIEWS – A GREAT WAY TO BUILD COMMUNITY AND PARENT ENGAGEMENT



Our parent-teacher-student goal setting interviews have begun this week. It has been well-received so far, with parents, teachers and students all commenting on how nice it is to be able to get into the classrooms, touch base with the learning that has already happened (so much of it already!!!) and collaboratively set goals for the rest of the year.

Children relish the opportunity to show and engage in their learning with their parents, and the research shows that this parent engagement and the ability to participate in purposeful conversation about their child's learning, helps build connection, partnership and leads to improved student outcomes! Win-win!

YEAR 6 TECH TEAM UPDATE



At St John's we have been using technology across our school in many different ways.

One example is Seesaw https://web.seesaw.me/seesaw – this is an app and program that the children can do many different activities that the teacher sets. Children can also use it for subjects like maths or English. All the grades use it across the

school.

The children from year 1 are using one of our most useful apps, the Google suite. They are using this to record what different baptism symbols mean. The Google suite is used to carry and share information and for multiple people to access at the same time. There are many different templates to help present your working out and projects. When children use Google suite they are introduced to many different fonts, shapes and other useful tools.

ENROLMENTS FOR 2019 - SPREAD THE WORD


