PRINCIPAL NEWS

Dear Parents,

Welcome back to school for Term Two.

Getting back into routine can be a bit of a shock to the system after being away from the bells and timetables of school life. Nevertheless, when children are supported in setting up and sticking to a consistent home routine involving bed times, home learning time, morning routines and fun times, many barriers to learning are removed. Establishing that routine can be one of the challenges of parenting but persistence pays off, so hang in there! Something else that pays off in developing positive behaviour in children is consistency. I was really impressed with our School Captains and our Mission Team who led a beautiful and respectful ANZAC Day prayer for us on Monday morning. Our children sat totally engaged with the ideas of sacrifice evoked by the red poppies and the sprigs of rosemary in the prayer space; the discomfort evident in the images of soldiers in various theatres displayed around the walls of the hall and the unifying but winsome sound of the Last Post and the Reveille played at the end of the prayer time. A sense of gratitude and the call to be peacemakers was left firmly in our hearts and minds.

Doing this on the morning of the first day of term was indeed a special contribution from our student leaders under Miss Dunk's guidance, and one that did provide our children with a meaningful experience of being part of our community, well done.

Lest we forget.

Last Saturday evening, the Parish of Warringah came together in St Kevin's Church at Dee Why to celebrate the installation of Father Reinaldo Vassoler as our Parish Priest. Over 700 people attended the celebration led by Bishop Peter Comensoli, Bishop of the Diocese of Broken Bay, with 300 of those attending the International Food Night following Father's installation. Our P&F and Advisory Council members provided a gourmet BBQ alongside delicious meals from the Filipino, Italian and Spanish communities. I'm pleased to say all of our meals were gone within an hour – compliments to our chefs!

It was great to see St John's families joining into both events. Father's installation and the response to it highlights the sense of welcome felt broadly within our Catholic community for Father but importantly for the leadership he is entrusted to bring to our Parish. Our two schools, St John's and St Kevin's are a vital part of the Parish of Warringah - that means you are too. All our families are invited to commit to building a strong and vibrant Parish and to support Father Rei in his ministry. I encourage you to look for opportunities to do this with your family during Term Two.

BISHOP'S VISUAL ART PRIZE 2018



"How sweet to my taste are your words, O Lord; sweeter than honey to my mouth!"


If you have walked through the school foyer this week, you will see the prayer space covered in honey, bees and bibles – definitely inspired by the above metaphor from Psalm 119.

This year, the Bishop's Visual Art Prize is based on "illuminating" a line of scripture. Unlike previous years where children have been invited to enter, this year every student at St John's will be part of the competition. Years 3-6 will be studying illumination, both traditional and contemporary, next term in Creative Arts. Kindergarten, Year 1 and Year 2 will create artwork based on the scripture of their Religion units. Each student will select an art work to be submitted for judging in Wk 7 of Term 2. Three pieces of art in each stage – Early Stage 1 (Kindergarten), Stage 1 (Yrs 1&2), Stage 2 (Yrs 3&4) and Stage 3 (Yrs 5&6) will then be selected for submission to the Diocesan competition next term.

We are hoping to display all of the artworks in the hall at the end of this term to enable everyone in our school and parish community to enjoy the children's creative interpretation of the Word of God.

SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION

In the Diocese of Broken Bay, each parish runs a preparation program for children receiving the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, Reconciliation and Eucharist.

Initiation is a gradual process that takes place within the community of the faithful, the people of God as represented by the local Church, whose responsibility as the baptised it is to hand on and nourish the faith of those searching for Christ.

The Information and Commitment Evening for the Sacrament of Confirmation will take place on Thursday 24th May (Wk 4) at 7pm in St Kevin's Church. This evening is the first step in preparing for the sacrament. The children who are to be confirmed attend with a parent.

Call out for Facilitators

We need parents to help facilitate the program in small groups. The Confirmation program involves four sessions of 45 minutes during which children and their parent(s) work through the activities provided. Facilitator notes and step by step instructions as well as any resources are provided each week. Mentors who have been involved in the program before are available to support new parent facilitators. Parents can also be co-facilitators and work together to run a group. Your role is to facilitate the groups but every parent takes responsibility for their own child's sacramental journey.

SCHOOL NEWS

NATIONAL SCHOOL PRINCIPAL DAY – TUESDAY 1ST MAY



Tuesday marked **National School Principal Day**, (which unfortunately I didn't know about until Wednesday!). I am grateful to have an opportunity to praise and thank our principal Mark Bateman in particular, as well as all of those working in this unique profession. Principals work tirelessly to make schools a place where teachers, principals and parents work cooperatively together to ensure our children get the best start possible. NAPLAN

In Week 3 (Tuesday 15th-Thursday 17th May) our Year 3 and Year 5 students will participate in 4 assessments as part of NAPLAN (National Assessment Program for Literacy and Numeracy). These tests involve reading, writing, spelling and grammar, and numeracy. It is important to remember that NAPLAN is not about passing or failing, but about assessing learning progress, and that the NAPLAN tests provide one part of the insight teachers have into each of our students.

A letter to our Year 3 and 5 students will be sent home on Friday next week.

As part of our ongoing professional learning at St John's, our teachers are participating in a few initiatives this term. This Monday and Tuesday all class teachers engaged in a CASL meeting (Collaborative Analysis of Student Learning) focusing on Maths.

The purpose of a CASL meeting is for a team of educators to work with a class teacher to analyse a specific learner in their class who they are 'curious' about in terms of their learning. The classroom teacher brings work samples and questions/hunches they have. The team listen and offer ideas and suggestions to try in the class over the next few weeks. At some point between the initial meeting and the wrap up meeting, the principal (and other members of the team where possible) will conduct an instructional walk and give feedback/feedforward/touch base with the teacher regarding the implementation of the ideas and suggestions. At the end of the cycle, a final meeting will be held looking at new assessment/observational/anecdotal results.

PARENT EDUCATION SESSIONS IN MATHS

In addition, we will be offering Parent Education sessions in Maths (ideally we will film these and display on our Weebly for those who are unable to attend). These parent education sessions will be offered in the morning and afternoon of Friday 25th May (Wk 4) as well as a session before our P&F meeting on Tuesday 29th May (Wk 5) – the maths session will begin at 6pm and our P&F meeting at 7pm.

RELAX KIDS

Relax Kids with Elizabeth Byrne continues this term with children attending a Relax Kids session with their class once a fortnight. These sessions have been very well received by both the children and teachers and it is great to see and hear children using the strategies they learn about in Relax Kids to help them to self-monitor and self-regulate their emotions on the playground and in the classroom. Ask your child what they have learnt!

WORRY WOO EMOTIONAL INTELLIGENCE PROGRAM - K-2 - TERM 2

As part of our wellbeing program we are running the Worry Woo monsters program for our children in years K-2, starting in Term 2, 2018. If you want to know more about the program you can; visit the website http://www.worrywoos.com/index.html, or speak to your child's teacher or contact our Family Liaison Officer: Jeanie.mcdonnell@dbb.catholic.edu.au

This program is being offered to help the children to develop their emotional intelligence. In total there are 7 Worry Woo lessons and each lesson looks at a different element of emotional wellbeing. Each lesson has a character which the children will be introduced to, there is a stuffed toy character in the classroom for the children to play with and connect with as a visual and tactile support.
