PRINCIPAL NEWS

Dear Parents,

We had a fantastic day at our Athletics Carnival yesterday. Our Colour House Captains did an amazing job instilling enthusiasm into their teams during the day. Well done to the children, our parent helpers and our amazing staff.

It is good to be back at school following my involvement in a three Francis's pilgrimage over two weeks in Italy. The group I was with explored Pope Francis's encyclical (teaching) about 'The Earth as our Common Home' (Laudato Si); the contribution of Francis Jordan, the founder of the Salvatorean Order of Priests, and we travelled by foot (about 150 km) to the beautiful town of Assisi to immerse ourselves in the life and times of the famous saint -Francis of Assisi.



Pilgrimage is very much about the experience including the joys, the challenges and the revelations than about anything else. Joys included the magnificent scenery, incredible history, beautiful liturgy, camaraderie, amazing Italian hospitality and the chaos of Rome! Challenges included the lengthy walks in the summer heat, coping with the feeling of sheer exhaustion; being unable to speak the local language and being away from the familiarity of home. Revelations included the magnificence of the Vatican; learning about the simple but incredible lives and faith of the saints throughout Italy; the impact and reach of our faith in the world and the courage of Christian people, especially Jesus, in the face incredible cruelty and persecution. I look forward to sharing some of my experiences with the children in the weeks to come. I am very grateful to Ms Ingram for her leadership of St John's during my absence.

In other news, Bishop Peter Comensoli, the Bishop of Broken Bay, has been appointed as Archbishop elect of Melbourne. I attended his farewell mass at the Cathedral at Waitara during the school holidays. Bishop Peter's appointment has come as a surprise to many of us in Broken Bay given his relatively short tenure with us. Bishop Peter's value for consultation, his positivity toward the people of our Diocese and his willingness to be involved in key issues in areas of education, especially during the challenges presented by the Gonski Report during 2017, have been welcome. Bishop Peter has asked for your prayers as he takes up his new ministry. Interim administration will be in place until a new Bishop of Broken Bay is appointed.

Acceptances for our Kindergarten grade for 2019 have been sent to all families. Enrolments for Kindergarten 2019 remain open. Please encourage families and friends you know with children ready to begin school to come and visit us and to see what St John's has to offer. It's happening on Saturday 3rd November – and planning is in full swing!



WHAT IS GOD ASKING OF THE CHURCH IN AUSTRALIA?



It is this question that has moved the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference to announce a Plenary Council of the Church in Australia to be held in the year 2020. This Council is the first to be held in Australia for some 80 years and will probably be the only Council held in our lifetimes.

A Plenary Council is the highest form of communion between the

various local or particular churches of a nation. It is, then, not simply a meeting of bishops but a process that calls for the participation of the entire Catholic community. It invites the whole Church into dialogue, to discern how its communities can live the Gospel with renewed vitality amidst new questions and challenges.

Every Parish and every school will be invited to contribute to the discussion. This means students, staff, parents – anyone who is part of our school community will be invited to take part.

Miss Dunk will be attending a session tomorrow to find out more about this process and how it might look for our community. The Plenary Council represents an exciting opportunity for sharing experiences (good and bad) and to look forward to the future and - dare I say – change!

PEER SUPPORT LEADER TRAINING

Our Year 5 and 6 students began training as Peer Support leaders today. This program offers opportunities for authentic student leadership and helps our Stage 3 students continue developing their resilience, their self-confidence, and their leadership skills.

The Peer Support program will then begin on Monday of Week 3. Peer Support builds student friendship networks across the whole K-6 cohort as well as helping all children be more supportive of each other.



Peer Support sessions

We are working on a module called Living Positively helping us explore the concept of optimism. The module runs for 8 sessions. Our first session enables the children to get to know everyone in the group, agreeing on how they will work well together and interact cooperatively with others. They will also begin to think about what it means to be optimistic. We encourage you to talk to your children about Peer Support every week, as it will help to reinforce the concepts learned in each session. We have had a few queries concerning class arrangements for 2019. At this stage, it is too early to be able to predict our staffing allocation for next year let alone our class configuration. The Catholic Schools Office decides staffing allocation for its schools based on overall enrolments, taking into consideration relevant contextual factors. Staffing for 2019, therefore, is not possible to predict until later in the 2018 school year. This information is usually shared at the P&F meeting for Term 4.


