PRINCIPAL NEWS

Dear Parents,

We have all been made aware of the plight of the farming community due to the current devastating drought. It seems the situation is evoking tremendous concern and outreach and our community is rallying to provide both financial and emotional support through social media and other means. At St John's we will be teaching the children about drought in coming weeks and sharing the stories of our farmers. We intend to help the children develop and understanding about what the word 'plight' can actually mean in daily life. Along with that will be some encouragement to reach out and use their amazing sense of compassion to take some action to help.

We have our Father's Day Breakfast coming up August 31st. We have joined the 'Buy a Bale' project which seeks to provide funds to buy bales of hay which will be used to feed stock. There will be an opportunity to donate towards this cause at the Father's Day Breakfast and we will be asking the children to bring a gold coin that day to give to the project. There is more detail further on in our newsletter. If you are not already involved in supporting our cousins in the country, perhaps donating to the 'Buy a Bale' project is something you could consider.

This evening, our Year 3 parents and children will be attending their Commitment Evening at 7 pm tonight in the Church at Dee Why. The celebration leads into the First Eucharist preparation program which begins over the weekend. As the final Sacrament of Initiation, the Eucharist brings the children into full participation in the life of their faith community. It is an important and wonderful step in building a relationship with Jesus and one that deserves your prayers and support.

We have our first Family Mass of the term this Saturday evening at 5:00 pm in the Church. Year 5 and 6 will be hosting the mass this weekend and all families are invited to come along. Our last mass was extremely well attended and we would love to see a similar response. Given the colder weather, we have decided to not hold a sausage sizzle following mass during the winter months.

Finally, we held two workshops this week to discuss our plans for next year's Kindergarten. My thanks to our wonderful Kindergarten teachers, Ms Cahill and Mrs Gillett for their contribution to our workshops and to the parents who came along and contributed so constructively to our discussion. We are busy planning for Kindergarten Parent Information Evening, Tuesday, August 21st followed by our transition to school mornings for our new pupils. A point of clarification coming from our workshops this week, is that 'Play to Learn' specifically refers to the process we use for our transition to school mornings. We use the 'Play to Learn' ideas in the first few weeks of school to assist the children settling in, but it is not a 'program' we use to teach our Kindergarten classes. Our main tools are the NESA syllabus documents and our focus is on implementing the syllabus requirements within a distinctively Catholic environment.

Should parents have any questions about our planning for 2019, you are invited to come and talk to us about them.

A meeting was held this week including members from the Bishop's Office, the Catholic Schools Office (CSO), the Parish and St John's school concerning the hall. Following recent engineer reports, we were advised that the hall is not compliant with Australian Building Standard requirements and cannot be used. Of particular concern is the use of the space by a large gathering.

As a result, OOSH services need to be moved and interim arrangements will be put in place to cater for the needs of the school and Parish. Time is needed to achieve this and the group will be meeting at the end of Term 3 with a view to establishing a clear way forward.

In the first instance OOSH services will be moved to Room 10 in the school and Room 5 will be used as an overflow space. OOSH will share the use of the canteen before and after school beginning Monday, August 10th.

Our prayer assemblies will continue to be held in the Church on Monday mornings. Award assemblies will take place on Friday mornings for Years K-2 and afternoons for Year 3-6 from August 17th. These will be held in the library or on the blue soft fall.

FEAST OF THE ASSUMPTION - WEDNESDAY 15TH AUGUST

Next Wednesday, we celebrate the Feast of the Assumption – Mary, the mother of God, being taken into heaven, body and soul at the end of her earthly life. It always surprises me how often Mary is portrayed as meek, mild and obedient. The words of many of our hymns convey that image: Gentle woman, quiet light, peaceful dove, our art works often show her with downcast eyes, not looking directly forward.

Yes, she was obedient and did as God asked, and, yes, she was humble. (Can you imagine anyone today being the mother of Christ – imagine the Facebook followers!) But there was nothing meek about agreeing to bear the Son of God – just the opposite – what bravery! It was not being gentle but having great strength that got Mary though the crucifixion of her son and helped her to continue to be his disciple afterwards.

The New Testament does not demonstrate a meek woman, devoid of creativity and initiative. It shows a strong, noble woman who put her free will at the disposal of God's will. That is what the feast of the Assumption celebrates: that because God will never be outdone in faithfulness and generosity, he remained utterly faithful to Mary through death, as she was utterly faithful to him in life.



The Assumption is a Holy Day of Obligation – a day Catholics are obliged to attend Mass (outside of our Sunday Obligation). The whole school will attend Mass with the Parish next Wednesday 15th at 9:30. You are welcome to join us.

*PS. It's often confusing, especially for the little ones to – Mary, Jesus' mother is not Mary MacKillop – having those feasts a week apart can be tricky!!

PLENARY COUNCIL

We have been talking so much about optimism and hope in our Peer Support Groups and last Friday I was in a room that was full of both as I attended the Plenary Council Animator Training. The object of the Animators is to gather the stories of as many people as possible in answer to the question: What do you think God is asking of us in Australia at this time?

When they say everyone – they mean everyone (it's an incredible logistical operation!). From the youngest (they've already tried it out with 7 year olds) to the oldest, men, women, devout practicing Catholics and those who have turned away completely.

I was pleasantly surprised by the attitude of the clergy about this Council, we are encouraged to be as honest and open as we can.

One of the most powerful things we talked about was "Why stories?". They want people's stories – not their opinions, opinions are formed by the experiences you have – it's about digging deeper. You see, you can argue with someone's opinion, you cannot argue with their experiences!



The Parish Council will be meeting with the Plenary Animators (fancy word for facilitators) soon and we look forward to providing opportunities to hear from as many of you as possible. Start thinking about the stories you would like to share!

BISHOP'S ART PRIZE



Hundreds of entries were received from schools across the Diocese and I did not envy the judges. The winners of the Bishop's Religious art prize have been announced and, unfortunately, St John's was not a prize winner this year. Nevertheless, we are still immensely proud of the children who were chosen to represent us. We all felt "illuminated" by taking part in the competition.

So rain please come back as you can see








THURSĎAY 16th AUGUST FROM 9.30am, we are cooking MEALS TO deliver or FREEZE for our school and parish families in need.


