### **PRINCIPAL NEWS**

Dear Parents,

You will be receiving your child's Semester 2 report this week by email.

I'd like to draw your attention to the sections of the report concerning **Effort** and **Values / Learning Behaviours.** These sections of the report are there to create a broader picture of your child as a learner. These areas do impact on academic achievement and are often worthy of discussion when talking with teachers about reports. A child can for example, be achieving at a 'Basic' level in a particular Key Learning Area (KLA) and be putting in commendable effort with their learning. Their effort comes from their attitude and values toward learning and school. The reverse could also the case.

When teachers are considering rankings for 'Effort', they will always begin with the standard expectation which is 'Working Well'. Movement to other categories will be done from this perspective. When teachers are considering 'Values / Learning Behaviours' ranking, teachers will begin with the standard expectation which is 'Usually'. They will move to other categories based on their experience and knowledge about the child. 'Consistently' in relation to 'Learning Behaviours / Values' is regarded as a more challenging level to achieve on our report.

You are welcome to contact your child's classroom teacher to make an appointment to discuss any aspect of your child's report via our sjan@dbb.catholic.edu.au email address or by telephone on 9971 9297.

Allocation of children to 2019 classes is in progress at the moment. Teachers will be trialling various combinations of children and we will inform you of class placements towards the end of term when we will send home stationery lists.

Term 4 is an extremely busy time in schools across the diocese - St John's is no exception. Our teachers have spent considerable time and effort preparing reports and assisting with the organisation of 2019 classes. Parent support for school decisions helps children to accept inevitable change and, perhaps, to get used to a situation they may not expect in relation to next year's class.

A reminder that our final day for students for 2018 will be **Wednesday, December 19**<sup>th</sup>. We will be holding our end of year liturgy that day beginning at 11:00 a.m. in the Church. The liturgy will be a time for thanksgiving and celebration of our year at St John's. We will present awards and appoint our school captains and colour house captains for 2019 as well as present 2018 end of year awards. All parents are welcome to attend. Parents choosing to take their children home after the liturgy will need to inform their child's class teacher. Supervision will be provided until the end of the day at 3:05 p.m. for any children remaining at school that day.





Students progressing to year 3 and year 7 do not need to re-apply if they:


- are continuing at the same school

- have not been sent an expiry notification from Transport for NSW.

If students need to update their information or re-apply, they should go to <a href="https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails">https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails</a>

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2018 to ensure student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card is not cancelled. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2018, the system will automatically cancel a card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out during December 2018 and January 2019.
