Dear Parents,

Parent Information Evenings are now complete. We were encouraged by the attendance at each of the meetings this year. All classes have settled in well and are in full swing. A lot has been happening already to encourage the children's interest in their learning. It is essential to ensure that there is a good foundation to learning – key knowledge and skills on which to build. The teachers have been busy establishing predictable routines and clear expectations and using lots of encouragement to help build the confidence of the children in these early stages of the year. Your positive support for class routines and expectations will make a difference to your child's learning.

As a staff we have committed to gaining a better understanding about thinking this year – looking at different dispositions, mindsets toward thinking and exploring how different thinking routines can assist us and the children to a clearer, deeper understanding about key ideas. We will begin using some of these ideas within our teaching during the year and look forward to the learning that unfolds along the way. This work is in line with our main teaching and learning focus which is to authentically engage children in their learning. I'll speak more about this at the coming Parents and Friends meeting on February 26th.

Our Semester One Student Representative Council (SRC) will receive their badges at assembly tomorrow morning. SRC members represent their class at meetings during each term bringing creative ideas, positive happenings and achievable changes to suggest. Congraluations to our new members – I look forward to working with you.

Congratulations also to our Year 6 and Year 1 classes for hosting our first Family Mass with the Parish last weekend. Father Francis led a very joyful celebration and it was great to see so many of our families taking part.

PARENTS' GUIDE TO HELPING CHILDREN WITH READING AND WRITING AT HOME

Parents make a difference to their children's reading journey. The joy and love of reading, of sharing a good book, of reading aloud or being read to, set the foundation for your children becoming successful life-long readers. A parent's role as an advocate for your child and their sense of success as a reader cannot be overestimated. It also has an ongoing direct impact on their confidence with all other elements of literacy and across the curriculum. We hope all of our parents give reading the priority it deserves and model good reading habits with their children too.

SOME TIPS FOR HOME READING

• Establish a home reading routine. Read aloud with your children everyday. Ten minutes for each child around a book of his/her choice. If English is your second language, read in your home language. If you lack confidence in reading aloud, the fact that you are reading with your child is what matters. Talk about the illustrations and contribute where you can. Share your excitement for reading and this will be the model your child will adopt.

- The reader holds the book! There is a lot of power and control in the world of reading. The reader needs to have the power.
- If reading time is stressful, move the reading to a new location. Instead of sitting at the kitchen bench, move to the lounge room floor, or go outside and sit under a tree or take the books to the local coffee shop.
- Find a reading time that works for your family. Limit the time and set the timer if reading in the past has always been difficult. It is better to have an enjoyable 10 minutes than a laborious 30 minutes where everyone is left feeling frustrated.
- At the end of the 10 minutes, ask questions that encourage discussion, for example: What was your favourite part? Tell me about the characters. What do you think will happen next? What did you think about that setting? What do like/ dislike about this book? There is no need to interrogate the reader. Make it a conversation as you would in a book club.
- Encourage your child to read independently. A bedside light is one of the best enticements for your child to read before going to sleep. After the 10 minutes of reading with you, the child can elect to continue reading independently.
- The less you interrupt the 10 minutes of reading, the more you are supporting the readers independence, resilience and confidence. Zip your lips, monitor the miscues, and listen as your child reads.
- Visit the local library make it a family ritual on a set day every week. Let your children select their books while you select books you are interested in reading. Not every book has to be read cover to cover. Your child might select books based on illustrations or factual information about a topic of interest.
- Independent readers pick and choose what they read. They are entitled to read some and reject others. They are entitled to not complete books because they are boring. Readers make choices.
- Model what it means to be an enthusiastic reader. Create a home of readers where everyone reads It is just what we do in this house! Talk about what you have read. Read aloud what makes you laugh and share it with your child .

Parents can use one voucher for every school age child per year to help meet the cost of structured creative and cultural activities, such as music lessons, languages, coding, drama and theatre, photography and graphic design.

IMPORTANT CHANGES TO ADMINISTERING MEDICATION

Parents please note that if your child needs to have medication administered at school a form is required by law to be filled out by your doctor with the correct paperwork attached to the medicine (by the pharmacy). The form (and medication) is to be brought into the school before our Admin staff are able to administer medication. This does not only apply to prescription medication but includes Panadol, Nurofen or any other over the counter medications.

This is a Diocesan directive and the MEDICATION POLICY FOR DIOCESAN SCHOOLS SYSTEM can be found on our website under <u>News & Events – Notes</u>.

<u>Asthma</u> and <u>Anaphylaxis</u> forms were sent home in week 2 to all children who are have noted they are asthmatic or have anaphylaxis. These forms should be sent back to school <u>no later than Friday 22 March</u>. All children are required to have an epipen and Ventolin at school. Please contact office if your child is no longer asthmatic or anaphylactic.

HEAD LICE

We have had several cases of head lice across all year groups this term. It would be appreciated if you could check your children's hair regularly and treat accordingly.

TIP- Nit Spritz: 500ml water, 20 drops water soluble eucalyptus oil, 10 drops lavender oil ... in a squirty bottle. Shake well.
