PRINCIPAL NEWS

Dear Parents,

Improvements to our playground equipment area have been completed and officially opened. The new improvements include:

- Finn's Hill an innovative play space designed for climbing, sliding, crawling and sitting. Finn's Hill is named in memory of Finn Marker, a student of St John's who passed away in July 2017. Each time we use the hill we are encouraged to think of Finn and all those who love him.
- A play stage next to Finn's Hill and a memorial plaque for Finn.
- A cottage complete with shop windows and counters.
- Recycled, re-oiled and reshaped play decks.
- A dry creek bed with fixed rockery and native plants to be used for exploratory and creative play.
- New, established Tuckeroo trees which will provide ample, natural shade to the area.
- A bush tucker walk-through garden.
- An underground irrigation system to nourish our plants.
- Drainage repairs to minimise run-off from storm events.

We officially opened our new sections on Monday with a very special prayer assembly led by Year 5. Finn's parents, Bridget and Stuart were in attendance. Finn's sisters Scarlett and Scout were the first to use Finn's Hill and helped us cut the opening ribbons. More work is planned for the playground. We will need to begin saving to replace the soft fall area under the play equipment and to add more creative items to the area such as a mud kitchen, some weaving frames and spare parts stores for making and building. Our aim is to provide a space that combines active, traditional play with opportunities for creative, unstructured play during which the children can let their imagination run free.

I am receiving enquiries about the hall. It is important to understand that all parties wish to see the hall back in action. The process for doing this is with the Catholic Schools Office. The **Catholic Schools Office Facilities Unit** has advised me that the following actions have occurred in relation to the hall:

- An architect has completed a report on the building and provided this to the Structural Engineer.
- The report will form the basis for specific works which will need to be carried out.
- The CSO has engaged a builder to quote the work, taking the scope of works into account.
- A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), which will set out conditions for hall use, is being drawn up at the Catholic Schools Office before being presented to the Parish and school for sign off.

A completion date for the works has not been made available to the school until the above has been done.

In other news, we have our Bush Dance coming up this Saturday evening. Mr Frazer has the children well prepared for this celebration. Thank you to our Year 4 parents for their organisation of our first event for 2019. We are looking forward to a great family evening of music, dance and fun.
