PRINCIPAL NEWS

Dear Parents and Carers,

The sacrament of Confirmation will be conferred this Saturday for the children of Warringah Parish. This is a time for the children to say a resounding 'yes' to Jesus. They have spent time learning about the connection between their Baptism and the sacrament of Confirmation. Confirmation is the time when the children will affirm and renew their Baptismal promises and make a strong commitment to welcoming God into their lives. Confirmation prepares them for learning about and receiving their first holy communion next year. It also helps the children to understand how God is always present in their lives.

The sacrament of Confirmation introduces an understanding about the Holy Spirit to the children. Simply put, the Holy Spirit, present within us, reminds us about and connects us with the love of God. The Church speaks of the gifts of the spirit which are always present and are constant reminders of God. These include:

Wisdom - the importance keeping God central to our lives and seeing God in everything and everyone.

Understanding - the ability to understand the message of God present in the scriptures.

Knowledge - the ability to explore God's message and recognise there are mysteries of faith that lie beyond us.

Counsel - the ability to see the God's way when we are faced with choices that relate to him.

Fortitude - the courage to be able to know and do what is right.

Piety - being able to pray to God with true devotion.


Fear of the Lord - is being amazed about God and wanting to never move away from our friendship with him.

Learning about the sacraments with our children is helpful for us as adults to be able to reconnect with the key ideas of our faith and their impact on our own lives. Congratulations to all of our children who have already received Confirmation and our best wishes to those celebrating this Saturday. Huge thanks to our parent and staff facilitators during the preparation for the sacrament.

Father Reinaldo will lead the Confirmation celebration at 11 am this Saturday morning at St John's.







Dear Parents,

The annual St John's Public Speaking Competition is on again early in Term 3. This is a wonderful opportunity for all of the students at St John's to experience public speaking in front of a group and for us all to see the depth of talent we have here at our school.

The previous competitions have been very successful and the children were able to present well- prepared speeches on their topic.

Throughout Weeks 2 and 3 (Monday 29th July – Friday 9th August) of Term 3, all of the children will present their speech to their class. All children will be expected to present a prepared speech.

Palm cards are permitted.

The top speakers from each grade will present their speech to the school on Friday of Week 4 (16th August) from 11.15am. This will take place in St John's Church.

The presentation will be assessed on expression, articulation, voice projection and ability to engage the audience.

Practise for the public speaking will become a part of the children's home learning in the beginning of Term 3 but we are sending this note home before the holidays so the children may start preparing. Remember practise will not only improve your child's presentation, it will also give them more confidence.


