In other news, I was able to share in some wonderful learning with our children this week. We had two Year 6 STEM (Science and Technology, English and Maths) teams attend a STEM Challenge Day at Mater Maria Warriewood on Wednesday. Our teams presented their projects on **Preservation of Bees** and on the use of **Solar Panels** to representatives of the 12 Northern Beaches Catholic Schools and did a fabulous job. Meanwhile, back at school their classmates were involved in their own STEM challenge, programming small robots we purchased to chart a course across a section of a virtual Moon surface in their classroom. Kinder were doing some coding with their robots (Beebots) which we purchased with our Earn and Learn tokens from 2018, thanks to your support.

Our School Captains accompanied me to NSW State Parliament today to meet with our local member, Brad Hazzard, and other student leaders from Catholic and Government schools on the Northern Beaches. Mr Hazzard encouraged those attending in their leadership roles and gave them an inside tour and explanation of the workings of Parliament House.

#### **UPDATE ON THE HALL**

Mr Bateman and Ms Ingram met with representatives of the Catholic Schools Office this week. We are pleased to inform you that work on repairing the hall will begin during the first week in September. The project will take approximately 7 weeks to complete which means the hall should be available for use early in Term 4.

Work will include:

- Replacing the current timber floor with a cement slab.
- Replacement of entry doors and adjustments to egresses.
- The installation of a vinyl floor covering.
- Internal painting and minor repairs.
- Repairs to the roof.

The Parish Meeting Room will not be involved in any of the repair work.

The hall will now be maintained by the school and repair work will be funded by the Catholic Schools Office. The land on which the hall stands belongs to the Parish. The hall will continue to be a shared facility between the Parish and the school. We are very grateful to have a timeline to work towards and we will be working hard to ensure interruptions to daily school life are minimised and that work is carried out with the safety of the children as a priority.
