PRINCIPAL NEWS

Dear Parents,

'Meet the Teacher' evenings have been well attended this week and have helped create a connection between home and school at the beginning of the year. Thanks to all parents who were able to attend. We want to raise community awareness about the topic of resilience. At St John's we do believe that building resilient skills is important for life and for effective learning. Communication 2020:

The sources of communication for parents during the year are as follows:

COMPASS notifications via the COMPASS app on your phone carry push notifications and latest events and happenings at school. It is essential that you have access to the app. This is also used for notifying us of student absences, receiving student reports and will be increasingly a major source of communication as various modules are added.



The Newsletter is emailed and sent as a link via COMPASS on Thursday afternoons. It is published to our <u>school website</u>. The newsletter contains our latest calendar, award recipients and school news including photos.



- **Facebook** our Facebook Page is for those who wish to subscribe and celebrates our student learning along with daily or upcoming events.
- **Qkr!** This app is for purchasing any items through the school e.g. lunches, pre-loved uniforms, school bags, paying for school events and tickets, paying school fees and other associated costs.
- We regularly use Google Forms to collect and send information about events mostly as a link via COMPASS.



Assemblies for 2020:

- We will continue to hold our prayer assemblies in the Church on Monday mornings at 8:45. We will also continue holding our merit award assemblies on Friday mornings on the blue soft fall unless the weather requires us to move to the hall. Merit Award recipients have their name placed in the weekly newsletter on Thursdays for presentation Friday. Strength and Gentleness Award recipients have their names also in the weekly newsletter but are presented their award at Monday morning's prayer assembly by the Principal.

Use of the hall:

The hall is now open for use and our **Before and After School Care and Vacation Care** services are back in action. Any bookings of the hall space outside of school hours need to be made through the school office or by contacting sjan@dbb.catholic.edu.au
Further work on the hall will be taking place in coming weeks and the hall will remain in use unless there is a safety issue related to work being done. We will plan an opening of the facility once work is fully completed.

Parking:

- Please do not park directly outside the Church on Waratah Parade between 8-9:30 am or from 2:30-3:30 pm. This area is used to drop off and pick up children attending school. Parents using Waratah Parade for pick up in the afternoons are required to register at the school office.
- Parents may drop off outside the school on Alfred Street between 8:15 and 8:30 am. Pick up in the afternoon is not
 available from this point as it is in use as bus zone. Parking outside of these hours will attract a significant fine from
 the Rangers. Please note, children arriving before 8:15 am should be registered at Before School Care which is
 accessed via Waratah Parade.
- All other parking is in local streets. We have a crossing guard and we expect parents and grandparents or carers to model the use of pedestrian safety by using the crossing.


RECONCILIATION COMMITMENT AND INFORMATION EVENING

SWIMMING CARNIVAL - THURSDAY 20TH FEBRUARY - IMPORTANT INFORMATION

All children in Years 1 to 6 are expected to attend our school swimming carnival next Thursday. Kindergarten will remain at school for the day as normal and year one will come home by bus from the carnival at 11:45.

In adhering to the Warringah Aquatic Centre rules and regulations, children are not permitted to wear face paint/zinc, coloured hairspray or have crepe paper in their hair or as decorations.

It is recommended that all swimmers wear a swimming cap when competing. If you have a cap at home, regardless of its colour or design, your child may wear that, otherwise coloured caps can be purchased from school for \$3 each. Our sport captains have been selling these before school – if you missed out, please see the ladies in the office. Please write your child's name clearly on the cap. This allows the judges and recorders to complete their jobs more efficiently.

Children are to wear their sport uniform and joggers to school, with their swimmers already on (please pack underwear for them to change into after the carnival). They are permitted to wear a coloured t-shirt representing their house colour. Please label **all belongings** including towels, goggles, shoes and socks! It is useful for children to have a plastic bag to put their wet things into after the carnival.

Children who are anaphylaxis please remember to bring your spare epi pen from home.

Updated Asthma forms and medication please return to the office NO later than Monday as we need to finalise all medication for the swimming carnival.

A reminder that children are not permitted to use the canteen at the pool. Parents may purchase goods for their child but each child is expected to remain in the grand stands with the teachers.

Please note, no parents are to be on pool deck unless they have a specified job.

Once again we thank all parents who have volunteered to help out on the day. Please meet Mr Bateman or Mrs Fountain at the pool at 9.15am.

We are looking forward to a fun and successful carnival.

IMPORTANT CHANGES TO ADMINISTERING MEDICATION

Parents please note that if your child needs to have medication administered at school, a form is required by law to be filled out by your doctor with the correct paperwork attached to the medicine (by the pharmacy). The form (and medication) is to be brought into the school before our Admin staff are able to administer medication. This does not only apply to prescription medication but includes Panadol, Nurofen or any other over the counter medications.

This is a Diocesan directive and the MEDICATION POLICY FOR DIOCESAN SCHOOLS SYSTEM can be found on our website under News & Events – Notes.

Asthma forms were sent home at the beginning of term to all children who have noted they are asthmatic. These forms should be sent back to school no later than **MONDAY 17**th **February at the very latest**. All children who are anaphylactic or asthmatic are required to have an epipen or Ventolin at school. Please contact the office if your child is no longer asthmatic.


This week in library we have had a week of love. As Valentine's Day will be happening this week we decided to make is a week of library lovers.






New School Banking rewards now available!


