

But it started me thinking about "ecclesia docens" which translates as the "domestic church".



Children learn first about God's love by experiencing the love of their family.

I like the way that Archbishop Coleridge describes it:

"The domestic church means to talk about the church as something more than this great big impersonal institution but as a reality that is grounded in communities of human beings and supremely in the prime human community that we call the family."

I took that quote from a short <u>3-minute video</u> which I think reinforces just how important family is in developing faith. It's well worth a watch and will reinforce what a wonderful job you are doing as the "ecclesia docens".
